### What Can Be Recycled at Home?

Place the following items in your blue-lidded bin:

- Paper and Cardboard: Newspapers, magazines, cereal boxes, cardboard packaging (flattened).
- **Plastic Bottles and Containers:** Milk bottles, drink bottles, detergent bottles (rinse before recycling).
- Tins and Cans: Food tins, drink cans, and empty aerosol cans.
- Glass: Jars and bottles (rinse and remove lids).

## What Cannot Be Recycled in Your Blue-Lidded Bin?

- Black plastic
- Plastic bags and cling film
- Polystyrene
- Food waste
- Electrical items

These items can contaminate recycling loads, so please keep them out of your bin.

## 2. Tips for Sorting Your Waste

Proper sorting is essential to ensure recyclable materials are processed correctly. Follow these tips:

- **Check for Recycling Symbols:** Look for the triangle-shaped recycling symbol on packaging to confirm it's recyclable.
- **Keep it Clean:** Rinse food containers to avoid contamination.
- **Separate Materials:** If an item is made of multiple materials (e.g., cardboard with a plastic window), separate them before recycling.
- Flatten Large Items: Flatten cardboard boxes to save space.

# 3. Where to Find Recycling Drop-Off Points Household Recycling Centres (HRCs):

- **Trowbridge HRC** (Canal Road Industrial Estate): Accepts larger items such as electronics, batteries, and garden waste.
- **Bradford-on-Avon HRC** (Station Approach): Suitable for smaller household waste and recyclable items.

## **Local Drop-Off Points:**

- Supermarkets like Tesco and Sainsbury's often have collection points for plastic bags, batteries, and textiles.
- Glass bottle banks are available in car parks around both towns.
